Last week on Monday and Tuesday we held a wake and funeral for a sweet little boy Devin Suau.

I had no idea how hard and exhausting it would be. What I am writing came to me last night and is what I witnessed over a five day time span: **WHAT I SAW**

What I saw was a priest say we need to help this family.

What I saw was a response to my SOS email to a group of people to help with the wake and funeral on short notice was a quick yes of course we can help.

What I saw was a flurry of what can we do.

What I saw was a police man say I got your back and my dept. will handle parking, traffic, etc...

and find a person to set up a camera so the people in the Church hall could see the funeral.

What I saw was after Sunday Mass were people putting out extra chairs for the funeral without being asked.

What I saw was a person bring to the Church hall cases and cases of snacks, water, and juice for the kids during the wake and cases of tissues for the Church.

What I saw was a person helping with the IT part of getting a video feed to the Church hall and other details I would never think of.

What I saw was a person get a therapy dog to come to the wake.

What I saw was a person directing parking with no experience at all but it needed to be done till the police could take over.

What I saw was the DPW handling signs on the streets and other things that needed to be done.

What I saw was a person put out a small contained fire outside the Church.

What I saw was a person help make sure the Church was in great shape before the wake and come back in the afternoon with dinner for me and to fold programs.

What I saw was a person that I texted for help show up within five minutes to fold programs.

What I saw was a person during the wake take out trash, put out more toilet paper, and any other need that we had.

What I saw was a person leave his house to help get Church parking lights on when it got dark.

What I saw was a person do Taekwondo with some little boys who had a very long day.

What I saw was a person come before the funeral, stay for the funeral, and after the funeral to address every need or problem I had and to pay his respects.

What I saw was a group come together to make sure the funeral Mass had enough coverage.

What I saw was a person leave his work and fix a crucial lighting problem two minutes before the funeral started.

What I saw was the community of police and fire from multiple towns come together to help give this sweet little boy the best sendoff they could.

What I saw was a community who wanted to help this family as much as they could during their incredible pain and heartache.
